On September 23<sup>rd</sup>, our 1-6 grade teachers had training on our new math curriculum. Thanks to Jenny Behrent for arranging that!

Goodall reported: Our Agriculture Incentive Funding Grant was approved to the tune of \$3,030. The FFA participated in their leadership conference in Franklin. 


