SRO Reynolds reported: The camera system has been working quite well. There are still some networking issues, but Senergy is working on that. After working with the Administration, Officer Reynolds has finalized the alarm response procedures and the signed documentation has been given to Senergy. Officer Reynolds continues to oversee the key fob distribution. Officer Reynolds collaborated with Mrs. Goodall and the Attorney General's Office to organize a digital safety presentation for the JH and HS students. That presentation will take place on February 27th. Officer Reynolds maintains a consistent presence at the Boys' Varsity Basketball games. Officer Reynolds is consistent with his daily duties, such as, walking the exterior of the building, engaging positively with students and Administration, and overseeing the crosswalk on 4th Street to ensure the safety of our students.

Hogan reported: All Football equipment has been turned in. The Football & Cheerleading banquet was held on November 29th. The HS Volleyball banquet was held on December 7th. JH Boys' Basketball County Tournament starts December 27th. 6th graders started practice on December 13th. JH Girls' Basketball had an Awards Pizza Party on December 14th. HS Girls' Basketball has the Riverton Holiday Tournament on December 21 – 28. HS Boys' Basketball has the Waverly Tournament starting on December 26th. Mrs. Hogan received an email from an official that stated how impressed he was with the attitudes and performance of Boys' Basketball team. He found them to be very entertaining. JH Volleyball started practice on November 27th. They have (7) 6th graders, (11) 7th graders and (18) 8th graders. HS Baseball may have an opportunity to play at Busch Stadium this Spring. The tentative date is April 12th at 6:00 p.m. Mrs. Hogan addressed the Board about possibly adding Morrisonville to our HS Track co-op with Lincolnwood. The deadline for this is February 1st. The new A Building lockers were installed on November 29th. Scott Day and Steve Condon removed the old lockers and will work on creating bases for some of the new lockers that overhang a bit on the

current bases. Ed Clark is going to start charging a service fee on photographs. He will be charging \$15.00 per 8x10 print. Mrs. Hogan asked the Board for permission to explore other options for sports photographs. Winter Carnival Dance will be January 20th. The Pep Assembly will be held on January 19th.

Hennemann reported: Pre-K snack compliance visit was December 7th. The K-6th grade teachers will have professional development training regarding IEP's and 504 plans on January 3rd. Leanne Gehrs will address the Board about Winter reading and math benchmark data. Formal evaluation observations are ongoing.

Goodall reported: There may be a new Business and Technology Concepts course introduced in second semester. This class will cover business ownership, finance, marketing and management. This course will depend on student enrollment numbers. 2nd round of teacher evaluations has begun. Mrs. Goodall has secured the following items through ROCTE: "The Empathy Belly: Pregnancy Simulator" and a document camera for the FACS department. Also hot plate stirrers for the Agriculture and lab sciences. The Sophomore class had a field trip to CACC on November 17th. FASFA opens on December 31st. Mrs. Hyde has communicated this date to parents and provided our ISAC contact information to them as well. The HS Interact group partnered with the Pawnee Lion's Club for a Christmas food drive to fill food baskets for the Pawnee community. The class with the most donations will receive a pizza party and a movie sponsored by the Lion's Club. SADD will sponsoring a blood drive on March 15th from 8:00-1:00. The Bloodmobile will be parked behind the HS gym. Junior Beta Club had a 50/50 drawing during the JH Boys' Basketball game on December 4th. All the proceeds were donated to the Pawnee Angel Tree. The winner also donated the winnings back for a total of \$280.00 donated.

To the Pawnee CUSD #11 Board Members,

I want to update you on my recent work at our school as the School Resource Officer. I have more to share with you this go around. My focus has been on ensuring everything runs smoothly and safely for everyone at the Pawnee School District.

Armed Intruder/Active Shooter Plan

- On January 3rd, during our School Improvement Day, Principal Goodall and I talked and went over about the school's emergency operation plan for handling an armed intruder or active shooter situation. We went over important parts of the plan and safety steps our faculty should follow in an emergency.
- I also encouraged teachers to educate themselves and try to imagine being in that situation to be prepared because our students depend on us.
- I also encouraged teachers who are trained in ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) to share with the new staff and teachers their knowledge of it. I am looking into classes to be certified in ALICE training and be able to train our faculty.
- Chief Harris and I also visited most classrooms to answer any extra questions/concerns from teachers and staff.

Emergency Operations Folder

- At Principal Goodall's request, I put together a special folder of emergency information for our partner, PAG.
- We wanted to make sure PAG had information to review to be informed on what the school district's strategy is.

School PA System

- Worked with Senergy to get the PA system working in the Varsity gym for morning announcements/alerts from both school offices. This was also a concern that was brought to our attention during the School Improvement Day.
- We managed to have both school offices announcements reach Mrs. Cooper's room, in which she helps both elementary and junior/high school students.

 I'm also trying to get the PA system working in other areas like the PT/OT room, Mrs. Bell's old art room.

Security System

- We've been dealing with some alarm issues conflicting with Central Illinois Security and Senergy, but these are being sorted out. This is how I found out the intruder monitoring with Central Illinois Security was still active.
- We still have a current intruder monitoring from Central Illinois Security. I called and verified, and they gave me instructions on how to cancel it. I had Mr. Burton sign the letter that I had to draft.
- I've started the process to cancel this system, which will take effect 60 days from January 10th, 2024, the system will be cancelled on March 10th, 2024. Per the contract the school district has, they need a 60-day notice before cancelation.
- The school district will continue to maintain the fire monitoring from Central Illinois Security.

Ongoing Responsibilities

In addition to these specific tasks, my daily duties continue to include:

- Campus Patrols: Regularly walking the hallways and monitoring the exterior of the school building.
- Student Interaction: Engaging positively with students and assisting school administrators with any issues or tasks.
- Incident Management: Handling incidents that require police involvement, such as traffic accidents in our parking lots, medical calls, alarm investigations, etc.
- Traffic and Safety Supervision: Overseeing traffic on 4th Street and ensuring student safety, having a presence in the back and north side of the school by making sure our buses are able to leave at the end of the day.

I'm always looking for ways to better meet the needs of our school and keep everyone safe.



days for students who were not making the mark, instructor perseverance in individual guidance, adherence and efforts within our MTSS homeroom program, and even additional practice within our newly established IXL math/ELA software addressing learning gaps.

Leading and Managing Systems Change:

Modernizing/Updating our JH/HS Report Card Process: With the board's blessing, I would like to update the process of JH/HS report cards. Up to now, report cards are postally mailed quarterly for junior high and by semester for our senior high. With technology advancements, many schools no longer send postal mailings, saving on human and financial resources. My proposal is that we distribute report cards via TeacherEase announcement along with simple step-by-step directions/screenshots on how to access.

Improving Teaching and Learning:

- IXL PD: Our Math, ELA and MTSS JH & HS team met on Jan. 3rd's SIP day to address any residual student account issues as well as established second semester IXL student-learning goals. We will be continuing with this software in 2024-25 as we gather data on the program's ability to address the continued learning gaps within our Math and ELA subjects post covid.
- Emergency Operations PD: With the partnership of SRO Reynolds & Chief Harris, I led our district through soft lock down, shelter-in-place, and active shooter training. This included one-on-one conversations/room checks with each teacher and a member of law enforcement.
- <u>Certified Evaluations</u>: Second-round evaluations are almost complete. I am having conversations with our instructors about their strengths and areas where they may address growth.




