
# Pawnee Grade School 2017-2018 Family Newsletter

#### RECESS

We've recently seen just how unpredictable the weather can be in central Illinois! One day we have temperatures in the 50's and within hours, we have ice and sleet falling. Students will go outside for recess as long as the "feels like" temperature is at least 20 degrees.

Sending students outside in frigid temperatures is dangerous; however, supervision can also be a problem when trying to keep them inside. Please help us by making sure your child is dressed for the weather. This includes wearing a winter coat (at a minimum), and maybe even sending a hat and gloves as well.

#### **ILLNESSES**

It's the dreaded cold and flu season, unfortunately. As stated in the handbook, please do not send your ill child(ren) to school. If your child is running a fever or is vomiting and/or has diarrhea, please keep them at home until they have been symptom free for 24 hours without medication. Students who receive antibiotics must be on them for at least 24 hours before returning to school. Also, if your child is ill and needs to be sent home from school, it is the parent/guardian's responsibility to have the child picked up within an hour of notification. Please help us prevent the spread of illnesses and keep our students and staff healthy.
