Mr. Kratochvil reported: College 101 geared for Sophomore/Junior parents was February 26th, with only 3 parents (2 juniors, 1 sophomore) in attendance; Blood Drive sponsored by SADD was successful; Career Day Field Trip at LLCC for Sophomores was March 12th; LLCC Prep Day for current Seniors planning to attend LLCC is scheduled for March 21st; State assessment testing will be April 9th for Freshman-Juniors and 7th and 8th grade will be taking the Illinois Assessment of Readiness beginning April 8th; Pawnee Community Education Foundation scholarship applications are due to Mrs. Hyde on March 15th; and the Canned Food Drive will be extended through March 29th.
