
• Grants:

• We have begun working on the budget for the 2023-24 Title grants.

• Other:

O June Summer School was held May 30- June 9. We were able to serve 25 students in kindergarten through second grades.

- Pre-K screenings were held from April 21-June 1 with 26 kids being screened.
 Our grant covers 55 students. (In previous years the grant covered 30 and we had a waiting list of 12-15 students.)
 - We have 44 spots taken so far (and 3 more undecided)
 - We have 2 students interested in the tuition program.
 - We are saving 3 grant spots for EI students
 - We have another Pre-K screening scheduled for August 15.
- August Summer School will run for two weeks starting July 31 we have 58 students registered

Living a Mission and Vision Focused on Results:

RTI to MTSS: Our school has recently moved from the concept of RTI (response to intervention) to MTSS (multi-tired-systems-of-suppot). The largest difference can be explained that the MTSS continues the multi-tiered supports within academics, but also adds the broader scope of student such as behavior, attendance, and family supports, as well as teacher-learning and targeted professional development using data. Our JH/HS has already begun this process with last year's discipline process that includes restorative justice and consequence tiers. This year we will continue to enhance our MTSS concept by adding IXL and "snapshots" as explained below. Professional development is planned with the lens of these goals.

Leading and Managing Systems Change:

IXL: Our JH/HS teams have discussed and are replacing "No Red Ink", a primarily ELA resource, with the implementation of IXL. This tool gives supplementary ELA and Math curriculum along with a comprehensive diagnostic system to target individual and group concept gaps. A beginning of the year, mid-year and end-year "snapshot" will be assessed in as little a time as 45 minutes, giving our instructors the data needed to lead targeted instruction, addressing learning gaps found in ELA and math. Additionally, it gives individual practice curriculum for students to complete targeting those gaps. This will strengthen not only our ELA & Math classrooms, but also our MTSS homerooms as well as state tests such as the HS PSAT/SAT and JH IAR. Lastly, it gives our top-tiered students additional curriculum to continue to extend their learning past classroom concepts.

• Restorative Practices: a mini-professional development is planned for all JH/HS teachers on the initial SIP days. This will establish a whole-team approach while also unifying processes regarding student discipline in a multi-tiered-approach.

Improving Teaching and Learning:

- Spanish Credit Recovery: Mrs. Hyde & I have worked with Mr. Wilson to create a Spanish 1 credit recovery option for students who have had two or more failures in Spanish 1. This will be comparable to our other credit recovery options and a different format that in-person for students who have continued to struggle learning a foreign language.
- <u>Band</u>: There have been some concerns about scheduling and students who have a commitment to band not being able to get scheduled. We have added one more period of HS band to Mr. Duffer's schedule for 23/24 to assist with this issue.

Building and Maintaining Collaborative Relationships:

- RECC (Rual Electric Convenience Cooperative) came on June 12th to present a check and take our teacher's photograph. We were awarded \$7500 which will be divided into our JH ELA classrooms and JH/HS art room for equipment.
- ROCTE PIG (program incentive grant) Grant: We were awared \$4,000 (3K for HS & 1K for JH) for the following CTE equipment: portable dishwasher for FACS, greenhouse fan, goggle ultraviolet light sanitizer cabinet for STEM, 3 compound microscopes, & 20 student texts for Space System Exploration/Astronmy were awarded.

Leading with Integrity and Professionalism:

- New Teacher Orientation & Mentoring Program: Orientation scheduled for 8/10.
 All new teachers have been assigned mentors and the new Pawnee Mentorship Guidebook, established with my last year's goal, will be provided for all new staff. This is a framework for the induction, the retraining and the supporting of all new teachers.
- <u>Professional Development</u>: Working on teacher professional development in the areas of restorative practices in discipline, IXL "snapshot" testing and data use, and required GCN training for the beginning of the school year/first semester.

Creating and Sustaining a Culture of High Expectations

- <u>Behavior Matrix Responsibility & Responses Created</u>: A JH/HS matrix has been created to help define student behaviors in terms of severity and the teacher/administrative responsibility of discipleship and accomanying responses.
