- 1. Economic Statement- Your Economic Statement is due by May 1.
- 2. SB 2260- Amends State Revenue Sharing Act. If passed, Pawnee would receive an additional amount equal to 11% of the total amount distributed to the school district from Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund during fiscal year 2016. There is a progress sheet with my report. It has passed the Senate and has been referred to Rules Committee in the House (\$213,771).
- **3. FOIA Request-** The Shriver Center emailed a FOIA request on April 5, 2018 inquiring about how many resource officers the school district employed. The FOIA request was responded to on April 9, 2018.
- **4. IASB Resolution-** If the board has a resolution they would like brought forth to the IASB, please let me know and I will fill out the paperwork.
- **5. Scrubber-** I wanted to let the board know we will be purchasing a new scrubber. Our old scrubber is 12-15 years old and is having problems.
