Safe Driving Initiatives

- I have received numerous complaints from residents and some school faculty regarding certain high school students' driving behaviors, I have prioritized addressing this concern. My approach involves:
 - Contacting the students' parents or guardians to inform them of the situation.
 - Collaborating with Principal Goodall during school hours to address the students directly, referencing the student handbook when necessary and highlighting potential consequences, including the revocation of certain privileges and potential police involvement if matter gets out of hand.

Homecoming Week Activities

- I had the honor of participating in float judging.
- My presence was at both the powderpuff game and the bonfire. Please note, there was an incident at the bonfire and is currently under the police department's review.
- I was on-site during the homecoming football game and dance. My focus was to collaborate with Principal Goodall and the faculty, ensuring a safe and enjoyable environment for our students.

We encountered a minor issue in the JH/HS involving an order of protection. This
resulted in a parent desiring to file an official report. I would like to praise our
principal for her proactive measures, promptly following up with some students
and relaying information back to me for the report.

In addition to the activities, I remain vigilant in my routine daily responsibilities. This includes walking the hallways, monitoring the exterior of our premises, interacting with and greeting students, and promptly reporting any concerns to Kratochvil, Goodall, and Hennemann At the close of each school day, I position myself primarily out front of the school, to provide a sense of security, making sure vehicles drive the correct way on 4th Street, and maintain safety among our student community.


- On the IAR tests we had 5 students Exceed in math 1 in reading.
- Teachers have wrapped up beginning of the year benchmarking data for math and reading. Overall the results are good. We have contacted parents and have started our intervention times. We will continue to focus on reading and math improvement in the grade school. Some strategies we are using that should help are:
 - o Pushing into younger grade classrooms to help with guided reading.
 - o Using small group MTSS lessons.
 - o Continue using our new phonics system.
 - o Focusing on using our new math curriculum for younger grades.
 - O Using Reflex math for computation and fluency.
 - o We are currently serving the following number of students in each area:
 - Math 51
 - Reading 45

Living a Mission and Vision Focused on Results:

- <u>Data:</u> Our 5 Essentials Survey demonstrated the following trends:
 - Positive: Teacher-Principal trust was demonstrated as positive data, Parent Involvement in the School showed an increase, School-Wide Future Orientation trend increased as well as Parent Influence on Decision Making in Schools.
 - -Because of this, we continue to have bi-weekly JH/HS team meetings, have moved Indian Shout Out's (formerly known as Positive Behavior Logs) as an established part of our culture to bridge school & home, and are keeping in practice with administration meetings for school-wide future orientation and keeping our practices of parent committee on items such as handbook and student discipline
 - **Growth Needed**: Teacher Collaborative Practices was our lowest score, followed by Academic Press/Rigor & Quality of Student Discussion and Quality Professional Development
 - -Because of this, we have established cross-observation procedures within our mentoring program and continue to keep our team meetings in person bi-weekly to collaborate, we are digging into IXL for academic rigor data, and are creating Extreme PD & IXL training for teachers during SIP days
- <u>Teacher Accountability</u>: At the JH/HS level teachers were asked to submit the
 following items: classroom management plans, Ellis credential pdf, emergency
 sub plans/regular sub locations, and to establish a google classroom for each of
 their classes. This will assist in supporting our educators when students &
 community have questions.
- New Teacher Support: Several of our new JH/HS teachers have had one-on-one
 guidance meetings with me to answer specific questions and address early issues
 that typically befall new teachers. Additionally, we have scheduled

cross-observation with mentors/mentees for 9/25/2023. This is where the mentee will observe the mentor. October, the mentor will observe the mentee.

Leading and Managing Systems Change:

- IXL Professional Development: IXL math and ELA trainings was held on 8/15 with our JH & HS staff. They are now implementing a diagnostic to all 7-11th grade students in Math and ELA. We will come together for more planning on 9/22. This data will guide our instructional decisions as well as give opportunity for students to meet learning gap goals by year's end
- Extreme Professional Development: Additional upcoming 9/22 SIP days planned: Go Guardian (B Wilson leading), Go Formative/Promethean Boards (Bolsen leading), IXL PLC
- <u>Professional Development</u>: GCN training is being completed by staff during these next few weeks.

Improving Teaching and Learning:

- <u>SLO Meetings</u>: Initial meetings were conducted regarding assessment choices for student-learning objectives (SLO's) and goal-setting for students as a part of teacher evaluations.
- <u>Teacher Evaluations</u>: Certified teachers being evaluated this year have already scheduled pre-conference, observation and post-conference dates for this first semester.
- <u>Informal Observations</u>: These have already begun and the teachers are greatly appreciative of the feedback based on a growth mindset.

Building and Maintaining Collaborative Relationships:

- <u>CACC</u>: field trip on October 4th, 2023. Mrs. Hyde will take the junior class to the Orr Building on the Fairgrounds. Students meet with over 100 representatives from universities and colleges as well as technical schools and military branches.
- <u>LLCC Workforce</u>: field trip on September 21st. Mrs. Hyde will take interested freshmen through seniors to LLCC's outdoor exhibition with over 50 employers. Students can explore career fields within the trades.
- Memorial Gardens Bio Learning Oppotunity: Mrs. Bolsen took our CP BIO 2 to Lincoln Memorial Gardens for tree and plant ID
- FFA Learning Oppotunities: Mr. Rawlings took our FFA students to the Farm Progress Show in Decatur, IL on Wed. 8/30. He is requesting an overnight trip for the FFA National Convention in Indianapolis Nov. 1-3rd. See attached for learning objectives and activities considered.
- Fall Sports Assembly held on Aug. 26: We highlighted all fall sports: FB Cheer, Football, Volleyball, Soccer and Golf. FB & VB did a run-in and a coach from each sport introduced each team's athletes. The Cheer Squad performed Loyalty and several crowd cheers. Positive comments were made about including all fall sports into the pep assembly.
- Homecoming: Our Homecoming Schedule for this year went really well! Hallway decorating, Dress-Up Days, VB Game with Court Announcment, Parade, Powder Puff, Bonfire/Pep Asseembly, Cookout with Class Games, and Dance are just to name a few of our celebrations!

Leading with Integrity and Professionalism:

- Senior Trip Update: Mr. Kirby has volunteered to accompany our seniors on the trip to Florida. Mr. Kirby has been a sponsor and chaperone for many years and is glad to be going to help strengthen the knowledge, skills and experience of our newer sponsors and be a male chaperone. We are looking to see how many other sponsors will be in attendance based upon funding in order to train some of our new sponsors. I am recommending two new hires for HS Sponsor for the 23/24 school year.

At this time only the 7th grade has time in the academic schedule for this. Also, Officer Reynolds is working on a cyber security presentation for our JH and HS students to occur 2nd semester.




