SRO Reynolds reported: Officer Reynolds collaborated with the Springfield Police Department, Sangamon County Sheriff's Office, Rochester Police Department and Chatham Police Department to organize a K-9 sweep of the JH and HS. This was a valuable training exercise for the K-9 units and handlers who expressed their appreciation for the District's involvement and allowing them to utilize the building. Officer Reynolds has worked closely with Senergy to maintain the security system in the building and has been diligent with getting any issues resolved quickly. Officer Reynolds continues his daily patrols of the school grounds. The Peacekeepers program is a great way to engage with the students in a positive and supportive atmosphere.

Hogan reported: HS Baseball has 21 athletes out. On April 20th, there will be a Tim Kratochvil Memorial Baseball game against Taylorville. The Kratochvil family has been informed and many are expected to attend. Thank you Coach Hennemann and Coach Sample for organizing this. HS Softball has 11 athletes out and 1 manager. HS Track has 19 athletes out. JH Track has 36 athletes out. All banquets, parties and awards have been completed for winter activities. A Concussion Committee Meeting will be held on March 28th. All P.E. staff, nurse, Administration, supervisors, 1 board member and both Auburn and Chatham trainers will be present. A meeting with all coaches will occur after the 28th to go over any changes and reinforcement procedures. Pre-season evaluations for Spring coaches have been completed. Post-season evaluations for Winter coaches should be completed late-March. Nevco has been working with the Mrs. Hogan and Scott Day to get the scoreboard working properly. 2 new receivers will be ordered to see if that corrects the issues. Mrs. Hogan will meet with all Head coaches after the Board Meeting to go over Summer schedules. Mrs. Hogan, Mr. Hennemann and Mrs. Goodall worked together to get a Google Form extra-curricular survey out to 8th-11th graders. This will help gauge the interest in HS activities.

Hennemann reported: All teacher evaluations have been completed. The February End-of-the-Month Assembly was held on February 29th. State IAR testing for the GS will be March 18-22. Arts & Reading Night Open House will be on April 11th.

Goodall reported: IAR Testing for 7th & 8th graders will be March 18-22. ISA Testing for 8th graders will be March 22nd. SAT/PSAT for 9th-11th graders will be April 17th. ISA Testing for 11th graders will be April 23rd. We will be increasing our dual credit math opportunities for the 2024-2025 school year as well as providing an alternate route for students to qualify for dual credit in CP calculus. 39 current 9th-11th graders are interested in a new strength & conditioning class. 17 of the 39 students are interested in a 0-hour option. A Concussion Committee meeting is scheduled for March 28th. The Lion's Club will host a breakfast this year in the school cafeteria on May 3rd. Afterwards, the Curriculum Awards Ceremony will take place in the Auditorium. The 5 Essentials Survey was delivered to all 7th-12th graders on March 11th. 3 separate E-Learning surveys were distributed to Guardians, Teachers & Students. Sports Interest Survey/Sex Equity Survey was delivered to students in 9th-12th grades as part of the ROE Compliance. All certified evaluations are completed. Non-certified evaluations are in progress.

- **JH ACE Awards Day:**
Brady Baka, Gia Fugnitti, Ty Lederbrand, Lydia Megginson, Mia Skinner, were selected to attend the 2024 ACE Awards Day hosted by the JH Schoolmasters on April 25th at Erin's Pavilion in Southwind Park. This honor goes to deserving 8th grade students who demonstrate the following: Group-minded leadership both within and outside of the classroom, leads cooperatively, encourages others, and plays their own part with tenacity/vigor.

Living a Mission and Vision Focused on Results:

- **PaCE Conference & District Work:** On March 21st, Mrs. Hyde and I attended the Illinois PaCE Postsecondary and Career Expectations conference held at LLCC. In the PACE framework, each student should have an individualized learning plan to help make decisions about career and post-secondary (PS) education or training, to plan a course of study, and to make financial aid assessments with family members. Mrs. Hyde and I are working this summer to provide a detailed framework for our district to submit to the state.
- **SAT/PSAT Testing:** of 9th-11th graders: April 17th
- **ISA Testing:** of 11th graders: April 23rd

Leading and Managing Systems Change:

- **Handbook Committees:** I have met with two JH/HS teachers, our academic guidance counselor, two JH/HS students, a parent of a JH/HS student for recommend alterations of our handbook for 2024/25 school year.

- **Student Chromebook Pre-Planning Meeting for 24/25:** I met with Mrs. Kirby to discuss this year's student chromebook successes and obstacles to help guide and refine our processes for the 24/25 school year.
- **Special Education Projection Meeting for 24/25:** On Wednesday, March 27th, our SEA met with district administrators for special education projections for the 2024/25 school year. This meeting supports the partnership between Pawnee and SASED with teachers and paraprofessionals as we evaluate what will be needed for students with individual educational plans for the upcoming school year.
- **Final Student & Teacher Check-Out Processes:** Upon my entry at Pawnee, the junior and senior high had a skeletal framework of protocols for student and teacher check-out for the last day of school. Last year we piloted a process put together by myself and a group of teacher leaders. This year we are continuing to refine the check-out process so that all materials, technology and fees are submitted back to the district in good order.
- **Automatic Absence Notification Trial Update:** I piloted an automatic absence teacherease email around 9:30 am for any students who are absent and have not yet been called in by a parent or guardian. Mrs. Johnson reports back that this has worked wonderfully during this pilot. It has

Improving Teaching and Learning:

- **Cross-District Mentoring:** One of our HS special education teachers went to Auburn High School to see their Special Education Programs. She will travel to Riverton next week. She has gained a lot of new and updated information regarding special education programming, resource teaching, single-subject direct instruction, and data tracking.
- **ROCTE Grants:** I wrote additional ROCTE grants that afforded us another document camera (JH & HS environmental science room and 6 scientific calculators (business room)).
- **Non-Certified Evaluations Completed:** I continue to observe our many paraprofessionals at work from 7-12th grade. This past month, I collected data and evaluations from each para's teacher-leader as well as each para's self-evaluation to take into consideration along with my personal observations to create a comprehensive evaluation for each paraprofessional.

Building and Maintaining Collaborative Relationships:

- **High School Scheduling Night:** March 25th in our auditorium, our academic counselor hosted a Parent Informational High School Scheduling Night. This night was open to all incoming freshmen through seniors and their guardians to inform and address any questions regarding class scheduling for the 24/25 school year. 22 families attended.
- **Senior Meetings:** On April 8th/9th, I met with all seniors to discuss the many activities and plans for the end of the school year (senior trip, prom, baccalaureate, parade, breakfast, awards ceremonies, photo ops, and graduation). These meetings were summarized in an email as well as a postal letter that was distributed to guardians. These activities are planned in close partnership with several of our community organizations.
- **MC3:** MC3 program along with O'Shea Builders presented to our students on 3/11. Currently, we do not have any students enrolling, but we continue to increase awareness and even offer dual credit math with the program.

Leading with Integrity and Professionalism:

- **Administrator's Academy Conference:** On June 6th, I plan on virtually attending one of the Illinois Principal's Association Administrator Academies. The conference I selected is designed to evaluate the concept of calendaring and deeply assess time management strategies in order to optimize efficiency and effectiveness both at home and at work. This conference's goal is to make the most of our work hours so that long-term burnout is less likely to occur.

Creating and Sustaining a Culture of High Expectations

- **IAR/ISA JH Reward:** On the shortened March 28th SIP day, the junior high celebrated their work on the IAR and ISA state tests by hosting a game day with board games and pinball tournaments.
- **Eclipse Viewing:** Mrs. Bolsen led this endeavor in cooperation with the junior high and elementary school. Viewing glasses for all students within the district were provided by the Pawnee PTO. The students were released to experience this once in a lifetime viewing experience on our outside fields, east of the school.

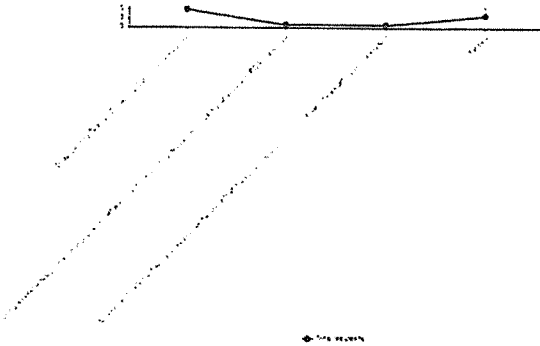

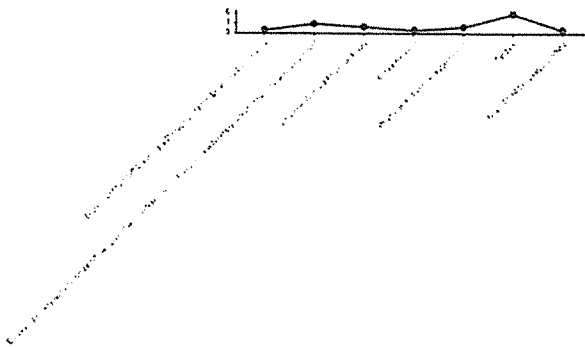

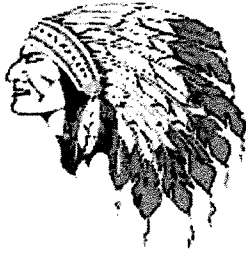
