I'd like to share a brief update on my activities at the school. While there are no significant new changes, my role continues to be active, adapting to the evolving needs of the Pawnee School District.

# Camera/Security System Management:

- Camera System Performance: The school's camera system is functioning exceptionally well I have not had any issues with the system.
- Alarm System: some networking issues but it is coming along, according to Senergy.
- We're close to achieving full integration of the new alarm system, with plans for the security system to automatically arm after 11 PM when the last employee leaves.
- Alarm Response Plan: In collaboration with our administration, I've finalized the alarm response procedure, as previously discussed back in November. The necessary documentation, signed by Interim Superintendent Burton, is now officially on file with Senergy.
- Door Scheduling: I'm getting more adept at managing door schedules for various school events.
- Key Fob Management: I continue to oversee the distribution and assignment of key fobs to school staff as needed.

### Junior High Classroom Engagement with Mrs. Sanders:

- Digital Safety Session: On December 14th, I engaged with Mrs. Sanders' SEL/study skills class, focusing on the importance of digital safety for junior high students.
- Upcoming Safety Presentation: On that note, as previously mentioned, Principal Goodall and I are collaborating with the Attorney General's Office to organize a digital safety presentation for junior high and high school students, we have it scheduled for February 27th, 2024.

### **Varsity Games Presence:**

• Ensuring Safety: I maintain a consistent presence at boys' varsity games, ensuring the safety and order of the events, and assisting school personnel with anything needed.

### **Ongoing Responsibilities:**

In addition to these specific tasks, my daily duties include:

- Campus Patrols: Regularly walking the hallways and monitoring the exterior of the campus.
- Student Interaction: Engaging positively with students and assisting school administrators with any issues.
- Incident Management: Handling incidents that require police involvement, such as traffic accidents in our parking lots, medical calls, alarm investigations, etc.
- Traffic and Safety Supervision: Overseeing traffic on 4th Street and ensuring student safety and making sure our buses are able to leave at the end of the day.

I am committed to continually adapting to the needs of our school and ensuring the safety and well-being of our students and staff.



# Leading and Managing Systems Change:

- <u>Second Semester Readiness:</u> Mrs. Hyde & I have been working on reading our classes for the second semester.
  - New Business Class: The introduction of Business and Technology Concepts CTE Course will provide an overview of all aspects of business marketing and management. Topics covered will include the various forms of business ownership, entrepreneurship, finance, management, marketing, administration, production, ethics, and careers. This class may roll out next semester or next fall depending on student enrollment numbers.
  - <u>Pawnee Musical Reboot</u>! Our Pawnee School Musical is back on track with Ms. Harris as lead director and Ms. Schreff as assistant. Auditions were held this past month with practices beginning in late winter!
  - <u>Band Student Teacher</u>: Conner Edwards, a Millikin University student, will be joining efforts of Mr. Carter Duffer and even Ms. Jamie Springman second semester at both the junior and senior high levels

# **Improving Teaching and Learning:**

- <u>Teacher Evaluations Continue</u>: 2nd round evaluations have begun accompanied
  with individual critical conversations pertaining to the improvement of teaching
  and learning. Areas of focus are positive teacher contributions, providing
  increased feedback to students, student-learning ownership, curriculum
  scaffolding, and utilizing data to drive instructional decisions.
- <u>Program Incentive Grant</u>: I have secured the following items through ROCTE monies to support existing programs: "The Empathy Belly: Pregnancy Simulator"

- and document camera for our FACS department and Hot Plate Stirrers for Agriculture and lab sciences.
- <u>Curriculum Cyle Review</u>: As some of our content curriculum and instructional strategy subscriptions expire this spring, I am polling teachers to gain insight on the use of our subscriptions.
  - <u>IXL</u>: This resource is being utilized heavily. We will continue the subscription and continue to learn more about this new student-learning-gap resource.
  - GoFormative: From an instructor, "It is a good resource for students to know if their answers are correct. It gives them immediate feedback, which helps me because I don't have to check their work (immediately) and I can help other students. It is also useful for students doing work at home to get immediate feedback on whether they are doing problems correctly. It saves me time and allows me to work on other things classroom wise."
  - <u>HMH</u>: on the docket to investigate in the spring

# **Building and Maintaining Collaborative Relationships:**

### • <u>CACC</u>:

- CACC Sophomore field trip: November 17th. The students toured the facilities and met with program instructors. Additionally, our presently enrolled CACC students were available for presentations and questions. A multitude of careers and military were represented so that students could ask questions and get more information. January 23rd CACC will present to our Sophomores about program offerings for CACC attendance for the 2024-2025 school year.
- <u>ISAC (Illinois Student ASsistance Commision):</u> November 20th Mrs. Hyde hosted an ISAC representative for a Parent Presentation on the Financial Aid Process including an overview of the FAFSA process. There were 17 people in attendance.
- <u>FAFSA</u>: opens December 31, 2023. Mrs. Hyde has communicated this date to our parents and provided our ISAC contact information to them if they need assistance in completing the FAFSA. Mrs. Hyde will also post any LLCC FAFSA workshops for our parents should they desire to attend.


